DATA EXCHANGE AGENCY STARTS RECEIVING APPLICATIONS FOR THE NATIONAL CYBER OLYMPIAD



Computer Emergency Response Team - CERT.GOV.GE of Data Exchange Agency of Ministry of Justice of Georgia starts receiving applications for the national Cyber Olympiad with the State Security Service of Georgia, which aims to promote and develop the cyber security field, as well as to discover and encourage the talented young people, who have the appropriate technical knowledge and competence.

All interested young people under 25 years can participate in Cyber Olympiad.

The applicants must define at least 3 members to form a team and submit the

appropriate application.

At the National Cyber Olympiad will be given cyber security attack vectors common tasks, which will be solved by the students divided into teams competing with each other.

As a result of various research and laboratory work the participants of the Cyber Olympiad will analyze and examine 5 different cases and answer 50 questions (10 questions with different complexity and weight around each case), the final statistics will be counted base on the answers. The duration of National Cyber Olympiad will be 1 day.

"It is one of our priorities to educate and master the young generation. That's why we decided to start a new project, called "Cyber Olympiad", which aims to give the students a chance to expand their knowledge in the area of cyber security (Continued on P.2).

(Continued from P. 1) Nowadays it is very important to achieve and maintain a high level at Cyber security, which of course needs the qualified specialists, who have the appropriate knowledge and skills. This is a unique opportunity for young people who are interested in this direction, in terms of mutual competition to represent their capabilities and improve their experience", - **Irakli Gvetadze**, Chairman of Data Exchange Agency of the Ministry of Justice of Georgia.

The national cyber Olympiad will be held on April 26, 2016, at the Radisson Blue Iveria Hotel.

The application deadline is April 6, 2016.

Based on the applications 50 teams will be selected by a special jury.

TFS STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING



Under the chairmanship of the Minister of Justice of Georgia **Tea Tsulukiani**, TFS Steering Committee has sat for intermediate meeting to discuss system's readiness for entering into the trial service and assess the work done by the parties involved in the process.

Trade Facilitation System (TFS) aims at harmonization of the electronic flow of information among key participants in the logistics, shipping, and transport industries, both public and private. TFS enables traders, customs brokers, freight forwarders, shipping lines, and other players in international trade to submit information through a single entry point.

The first stage of the project implies the establishment of automated information sharing tool, which

affects all parties involved in the container import/export operations. The various components of the system are currently being tested for proper operation.

All parties involved in the project will once again get acquainted with the whole cycle of import process and identify any weaknesses, the system might unveil during the test mode.

TFS will substitute 1 million paper documents annually. TFS streamlined procedures will save 3.7 hour of the operators' working time and 26 printed pages on each container, the total annual estimated savings related to the containers management would be 4,530,000 GEL.

Parties involved in the project include: Revenue Service, Georgian Railway, Poti and Batumi Sea Ports, shipping lines, terminals and expeditors.

Entities involved in the trade facilitation system are well aware of the barriers and obstacles, still found in the reality. With the help of Trade Facilitation System Entities involved in the trade operations will deal with the applicable public and private institutions in a simplified and coordinated manner. They shall benefit of a so called one-stop-shop service principle. Establishment of the Common Trade network will facilitate the inflow of new investments to Georgia and further improve the alluring reputation of a business-friendly country. The establishment of the system has been carried through an immediate support of USAID.

SEMINAR ON E-PARTICIPATION ISSUES



Analytical Department of the Ministry of Justice of Georgia, LEPL. Data Exchange Agency (DEA) and EU Twinning Project "Support to Strengthening of e-Governance in Georgia II" held one day workshop on e-participation "How to Advance use of ICT for transparent and participatory governance in Georgia?"

The workshop highlighted the role of ICT in public administration reform and identify new opportunities to advance transparent and participatory governance in Georgia with particular objective to introduce the plan to develop a national e-participation strategy based on international and national experiences/best practices.

Representatives of the Ministries and Agencies responsible for PAR Roadmap implementation, members of collegial bodies working on the field of anti-corruption and OGP, civil society organizations and international donors participated in the workshop.

CERTIFICATE GIVING CEREMONY WAS HELD FOR THE ATTENDEES OF DEA'S NEW LEARNING COURSE

Data Exchange Agency of Ministry of Justice of Georgia and its Division of Information Security and Policy held a certificate giving ceremony for those students who attended the agency's new learning course - Organization and Management Systems, which aimed at helping popularize information security and raise awareness in this direction.

The course enabled attendants to gain knowledge about the importance of well-established management systems for the organization and their role in ensuring information security.

Through the course, students acquired theoretical, as well as practical skills in the following directions: organization and organizational context analyses; governance and management; the nature of process; technologies and information systems; the levels or organization's development; continuous improvement; roles and responsibilities; resources; communication, documentation; management systems and their role.

The full course included 6 training weeks. A week provided 2-3 hour sessions. Each lecture came along with a special laboratory work and theoretical material. A number of additional manual guides and practical exercises were prepared for the course.



ELECTRONIC MAPS OF PUBLIC REGISTRY HAVE BECOME AVAILABLE TO EVERYONE

The electronic maps of National Agency of Public Registry are available to all interested parties. The various digital maps placed on Napr.gov.ge offer varied services to users - citizens and specialists.

On the electronic cadastral map all the interested parties can view their desired area via the internet, for free, they can also get to know its location and registration documents. Map has got a variety of search parameters, respectively, it is possible to search a plot according to the location, region and cadastral code. On parallel Searching, interested parties have opportunity to select the interesting section on the cadastral map, and pay the appropriate fee and download the desired extract (Continued on P.4).
