At a meeting held at Courtyard Marriott hotel, representatives of LEPL Data Exchange Agency of the Ministry of Justice of Georgia together with private sector representatives discussed the issues of

integration of e-Services provided by the private sector into the My.gov.ge platform. During the meeting, private sector representatives were provided with full information about the purpose and practical use of Unified Portal of e-Services. The event was organized by LEPL Data Exchange Agency of the Ministry of Justice of Georgia and supported by UNDP.

At the meeting, which was attended by eleven private companies, the parties have discussed those benefits that will be become tangible in case of integrating e-Services owned by public sector into My.gov.ge, which is a modern, secure and flexible platform. Among the companies participating in the meeting, were large players of insurance, banking, pharmaceutical and telecommunication market with successful track-record of designing and administrating a sizable number of e-Services (Continued on P. 2).

(Continued from P. 1) "Meetings of this type are very useful because we can provide direct communication with private sector in order to discuss important issues, such as increasing access to electronic services. It is very positive that the private sector offers both physical and legal entities a considerable number of electronic services that save user's time, finances and energy. We offer the private sector a ready-made platform that brings together e-Services available at public sector. We believe that integration of private sector e-Services into this platform will increase the frequency of usage of these services. For example, we are already working on integrating travel insurance service into the portal and hope that the share of private sector services will gradually be increased." – **Nikoloz Gagnidze**, DEA Chairman.

REPRESENTATIVES OF LEPL DATA EXCHANGE AGENCY INTRODUCED CURRENT PROJECTS TO THE MALAYSIAN DELEGATION



On April 24, at Tbilisi Public Service Hall, Malaysian Delegation comprised of representatives from various governmental agencies held meeting with the representatives of LEPL Data Exchange Agency of the Ministry of Justice of Georgia, during which visiting side has received detailed information on current e-governance projects, data exchange infrastructure, available electronic services and cyber security activities taken by Georgia. The overall experience accumulated by the Agency over the past few years was also shared with the guest. During the

meeting, special attention was paid to the Competency Center project, which was started by the initiative of Data Exchange Agency with the aim to facilitate export of Georgian reforms at an international level.

Within the framework of the visit, the Malaysian delegation also met with representatives of the Legal Entities of Public Law of the Ministry of Justice of Georgia - National Agency of Public Registry, Public Service Hall, as well as Tbilisi City Hall and Social Service Agency.

"We are delighted that representatives of different countries are becoming interested in sharing our agency's experience. DATA EXCHANGE AGENCY STARTS RECEIVING APPLICATIONS FOR THE NATIONAL CYBER OLYMPIAD 2019

Computer Emergency Response Team - CERT.GOV.GE of Data Exchange Agency of Ministry of Justice of Georgia starts receiving applications for the national Cyber Olympiad, which aims to promote and develop the cyber security field, as well as to discover and encourage the talented young people, who have the appropriate technical knowledge and competence.

All interested young people under 25 years can participate in Cyber Olympiad.

The applicants must define at least 3 members to form a team and submit the appropriate application.

At the National Cyber Olympiad will be given cyber security attack vectors common tasks, which will be solved by the students divided into teams competing with each other.

To take part in the Olympiad, contestants are required to possess basic knowledge in the following fields: networking, scripting, and web development.

As a result of various research and laboratory work the participants of the Cyber Olympiad will analyze and examine 5 different cases and answer 50 questions (10 questions with different complexity and weight around each case), the final statistics will be counted base on the answers. The duration of National Cyber Olympiad will be 1 day.

The national cyber Olympiad will be held on May 31, 2019, at the Radisson Blue Iveria Hotel.

The application deadline is May 27, 2019.

Based on the applications 50 teams will be selected by a special jury.
