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TRAINING IN INFORMATION SECURITY MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS FOR THE REPRESENTATIVES OF GEOCELL LLC



Data Exchange Agency of the Ministry of Justice of Georgia and the members of its information security and policy division held training sessions for the top-level management.

During the training special attention was paid to the issues, such as management system and information security, risk management and the benefits organization can get

by utilizing these methods. Training attendees also got acquainted to the requirements of ISO27001:2013, which should be met by an organization for assuring its information security. Being in compliance with those requirements bears critical importance not only for the particular organization, but for the whole country as well, since it sets necessary standards for achieving and then maintaining a high level of information security.

"Our agency is regularly conducting such trainings designed for both subjects of critical infrastructure [proper operation of which bears critical importance for the country] and private sector, aiming at quality improvement of satisfying requirements set by the Georgia's law of information security, and in general, having existed standards put in compliance with internationally recognized norms. It must also be noted that only in June, 2016 representatives of Data Exchange Agency have already held 2 training sessions named "Information Security Management System, Requirements and audit"/"Introduction of Information Security, Implementation and Audit". These trainings were attended by more than 35 representatives of subjects of critical infrastructure. ANOTHER MEETING OF CYBER SECURITY FORUM OF GEORGIA HELD AT THE STATE SECURITY AND CRISIS MANAGEMENT COUNCIL'S OFFICE

Cyber Security strategy and a plan of action of Georgia, which was developed, at the council's office, has been presented to the representatives of public and private sector. The document represents the conceptual road map for national security.

This document defines the problems, challenges and threats in the field of cyber security and also strengthens their prevention and reduction measures. Cyber security strategy of Georgia and its action plan were assessed



by the participants as the document, which properly defines priorities.

It should be noted that the meeting was attended by all the main players of the telecommunications market of Georgia. Their involvement is very important and promotes the development process of the strategy and its action plan as far as the private sector holds the largest part of the critical information systems of Georgia.

TRAINING IN INFORMATION SECURITY RISK MANAGEMENT FOR THE REPRESENTATIVES OF PUBLIC SERVICE DEVELOPMENT AGENCY

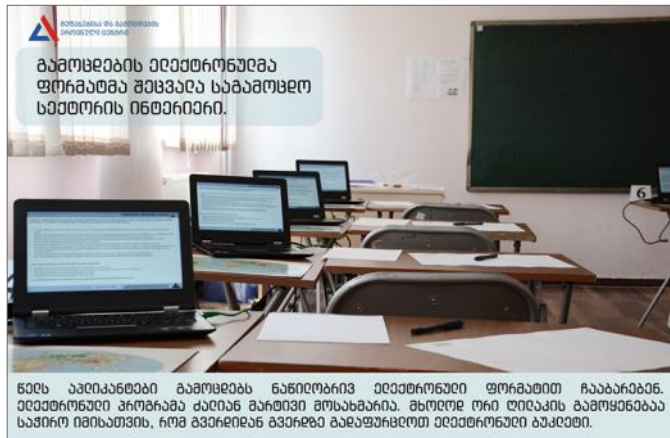


Data Exchange Agency of the Ministry of Justice of Georgia and the members of its information security and policy division held training sessions for the representatives of Public Service Development Agency. Training session was conducted under the requirements of Georgia's law of information security and aimed at providing necessary knowledge of fundamentals of information security risk management, its implementation and audit. "Sakaeronavigatsia" is a subject of critical infrastructure, proper operation of which bears critical importance for the country.

During the training session, representatives of Public Service Development Agency received comprehensive information about the principal requirements of information security, fulfilment of which are a mandatory [at all stages] for the organization undergoing the process of information security management system formation, implementation and improvement.

Within the course, trainees also updated their knowledge on the ways of practical implementation of information security, thus enabling their representative organizations to be in compliance with the requirements of law of information security of Georgia.

FOR THE FIRST TIME THIS YEAR, NATIONAL EXAMS ARE PARTIALLY BEING HELD IN ELECTRONIC FORM



Switching to an electronic format implies particular advantages. The difference between the printed version of exam materials and the electronic module is significant, since the latter one provides more capabilities for college entrant by streamlining the process of perception of given material.

In case of electronic form, examination material is comfortably displayed on the screen, which enables an entrant to use only two buttons for navigation. I.e. zooming in and out the text, easily

move from one page to another etc. This means that an entrant will be able to work on his/her task in a more comfortable environment. There is an ongoing work to move on a full e-Examination platform for the next year.

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
