Computer Emergency Response Team - CERT.GOV.GE of Data Exchange Agency of Ministry of Justice of Georgia starts receiving applications for the national Cyber Olympiad, which aims to promote and develop the cyber security field, as well as to discover and encourage the talented young people, who have the appropriate technical knowledge and competence.

All interested young people under 25 years can participate in Cyber Olympiad.

The applicants must define at least 3 members to form a team and submit the appropriate application.

At the National Cyber Olympiad cyber security attack vectors common tasks will be given, which contestants should resolve. They will be divided into teams competing with each other.

To take part in the Olympiad, contestants are required to possess basic knowledge in the following fields: networking, scripting, and web development.

As a result of various research and laboratory work the participants of the Cyber Olympiad will analyze and examine 5 different cases and answer 50 questions (10 questions with different complexity and weight around each case), the final statistics will be counted base on the answers. The duration of National Cyber Olympiad will be 1 day (Continued on P. 2).



(Continued from P.1) The national cyber Olympiad will be held on May 7, 2018, at the Radisson Blue Iveria Hotel.

The application deadline is May 3, 2018.

Based on the applications 50 teams will be selected by a special jury.

The mobile application and Parliamentary website public information module allow introduction of the public information of the Parliament, involvement in legislative activity and sending questions to the Parliament.

The new e-service aiming at facilitation to openness of the Parliament and public involvement in legislative activity, has been developed with EU/UNDP support and in cooperation with IDFI.

Application of hi-tech and innovations in improvement of public administration is one of the critical tasks of OGP. One of the obligations of the Open Parliament action plan envisages creation of the public information module and simplification of access to the information about the Parliamentary activity, including simplified upload of the documents.

On March 25-31, representatives of LEPL Data Exchange Agency of the Ministry of Justice of Georgia participated in the twelfth International Conference - Digital Society and eGovernments – ICDC 2018, held in Rome, Italy.

This conference is one of the world-scale events of its kind, which is attended by the representatives of private, public, academic sectors of various countries, as well as state delegations and private entities. The event is organized by IARIA (The International Academy, Research and Industry Association).

DEA's involvement in the conference was planned during the working meeting held as part of the project implemented by GIZ (The Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit) within EU Eastern partnership initiative, which shares the title of "e-Governance for Citizen-centric and Transparent Administrative Processes".

During the conference, representatives of Data Exchange Agency took part in sessions related to Smart Cities; Smart Nations; Citizen-centric projects and decisions; Citizen Participation in digital government; e-Learning and many more. During the working meeting with the representatives of Eastern Partnership countries, prospects for future meetings with relative agenda and the nature of working process have also been planned, which will be implemented within GIZ project.
