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CHEKNET - DEA HAS LAUNCHED FREE ONLINE SERVICE DESIGNED TO CHECK WEBSITES AND IP ADDRESSES FOR WEAKNESSES AND VULNERABILITIES



The Computer Emergency Response Team of Data Exchange Agency of the Ministry of Justice of Georgia CERT.GOV.GE actuated free online resource

"CheckNet" (www.checknet.ge) aims to promote and establish a safe Internet environment in the country.

The Portal "CheckNet" allows any user, who is residing in Georgia to: examine the history of Georgian

websites and understand what kind of security problems were fixed about them at different times; get the information about existing problem on a specific website by seeing the history of records of the website. For example to know whether the specific website is broken or not, whether there is the so-called Malicious code in it or not, which makes them dangerous in terms of infecting the computer, making purchases and other operations; check their own IP addresses and get the information about their infection or the fact of getting into the black list (if the fact exists).

To get this information it is enough for the user to enter the desired website address in the specially designated field and the system will bring up the appropriate notifications in a few seconds.

Besides finding the information, the user can add the discovered incident to the portal of database by himself, which will be immediately reacted from the side of CERT.GOV.GE. The other statistical information is also available at the portal, such as, for example, most often infected IP addresses list, the percentage indicators of infection types and etc.

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DEA HELD THE RETREAT WORKSHOP ON REGIONAL CYBER SECURITY ISSUES IN COOPERATION WITH NATO



Data Exchange Agency of the Ministry of Justice of Georgia within the NATO program "Science for Peace and Security" (SPS), held the usual workshop at the branch of the Training Center of justice in Kvareli, which was dedicated to the identification of the improved means of cooperation at cybersecurity and the regional cyber defense providing issues at the South Caucasus and Black Sea countries.

The common use of critical infrastructure cyber security issues were discussed at the meeting, as well as the means of the institutional capacity development issues and the prospects of enhancing cooperation in this direction.

All of this supports to increase the level of cyber security not only in Georgia, but in regional countries as well and also creates the opportunity for the citizens to be protected from the variety of cyber threats.

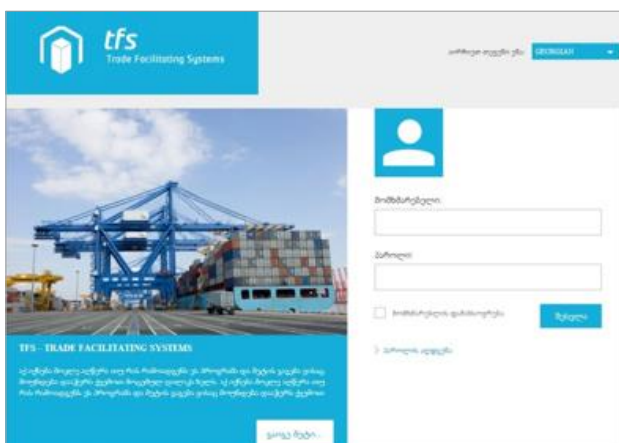
Participating countries together with representatives of the meeting also decided to initiate and support a new project for Data Exchange Agency of the Ministry of Justice of Georgia, which gives DEA the opportunity to realize specific teaching and research programs within the NATO program "Science for Peace and Security" (SPS).

Data Exchange Agency of the Ministry of Justice of Georgia hosted up to 15 representatives to participate in the workshop - NATO- member countries cyber security experts, specialists of the region countries and the representatives, working in the direction of cyber security issues in Georgia.

It should be noted that this meeting is an extension of a large-scale workshop, which was held on June this year, organized by Data Exchange Agency of the Ministry of Justice of Georgia and NATO.

"The following meetings with NATO- member countries are the result of our effective work. For example, the representatives of Data Exchange Agency, within the NATO program "Science for Peace and Security" (SPS), successfully have been conducting the trainings for cyber and information security specialists from different countries for years; we also had active cooperation in the direction of the cyber incidents neutralization. TFS IS IN A PROCESS OF FINAL TESTING



Data Exchange Agency of the Ministry of Justice of Georgia is implementing Trade Facilitation System (TFS), which aims at harmonization of the electronic flow of information among key participants in the logistics, shipping, and transport industries, both public and private. TFS enables traders, customs brokers, freight forwarders, shipping lines, and other players in international trade to submit information through a single entry point.

The first stage of the project implies the establishment of automated information sharing tool, which affects all parties involved in the container import/export operations. The various components of the system are currently being tested for proper operation. All parties involved in the project will once

again get acquainted with the whole cycle of import process and identify any weaknesses, the system might unveil during the test mode (Continued on P.3).

Parties involved in the project include: Revenue Service, Georgian Railway, Poti and Batumi Sea Ports, shipping lines, terminals and expeditors.

Entities involved in the trade facilitation system are well aware of the barriers and obstacles, still found in the reality. With the help of Trade Facilitation System Entities involved in the trade operations will deal with the applicable public and private institutions in a simplified and coordinated manner. They shall benefit of a so called one-stop-shop service principle. Establishment of the Common Trade network will facilitate the inflow of new investments to Georgia and further improve the alluring reputation of a business-friendly country.

Trade Facilitation System is another example of public-private partnership in Georgia. The establishment of the system has been carried through an immediate support of USAID.
